
The Optune



Jay Beck, Author, Speaks to Optimists, June 6





On Monday, June 6, Jay Beck, novelist and former White House staffer, spoke to the Rome Noon Optimist. Jay is formerly from Albany, Georgia where he established lifelong friendships with former President Jimmy Carter and White House Chief of Staff Hamilton Jordan. He began his career in advertising in Georgia but eventually, moved to Washington, DC to work as a staffer at the White House.

While at the White House, Jay focused on deregulation of businesses in transportation, oil and gas, and telecommunications. "Business lobbyists during this time built in rules and regulations into the system to protect their businesses at the expense of others" said Beck. This limited businesses in some areas of the country.

Eventually, Jay left Washington and moved to New York City to work in a

media firm. The firm managed cam paigns and designed ads. Beck worked internationally and domestically n the southeast.

Based on his various job experiences, Jay has written three historical fiction novels; "Panama Rust", "Casting Stones", and "The Third Party". "Panama Rust" and "Casting Stones" were written based on his experiences as a consultant during the 1984 presidential election in Panama and in 1985 in the Greece elections. The latter book received the Georgia Individual Author Award for the best historical novel in 2009. 'The Third Party' was written on his experiences as he worked as a consultant for the Ross Perot presidential campaign. Beck described that campaign "as the most successful third party presidential campaign".
